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

















OPENING CEREMONY









































EXHIBITION BOOTH INNOVATION




















































































































































































CONFERENCE SESSIONS

With the hindsight of burnt fingers from high-cost upstream investments in recent years, operators sought to determine if a more bankable option was downstream. Mr. Victor Eromosele, CEO of Mentor Energy Consulting chaired the session sponsored by EMADEB ENERGY. he sixth session dwelt on the dynamics of futuristic trends predicted to change the way the industry operates - DOWNSTREAM'S DISRUPTIVE INFLUENCES: THE ROLE OF LPG, PETROCHEMICALS AND RENEWABLES. 




















COMMUNIQUE


NETWORKING SESSIONS



















































































































































OPENING COCKTAIL — SARO - THE MUSICAL




















































OTL DOWNSTREAM INDUSTRY DINNER



























THE RED CARPET


